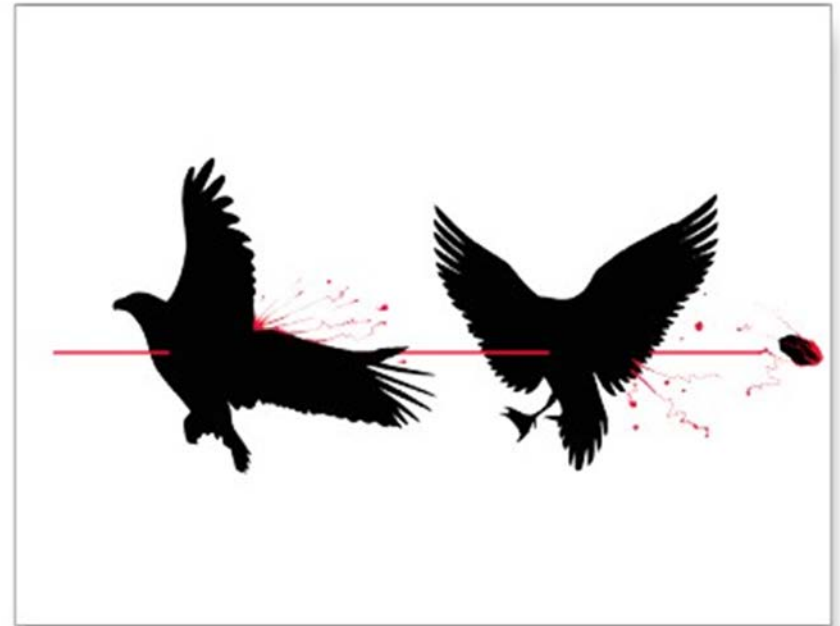
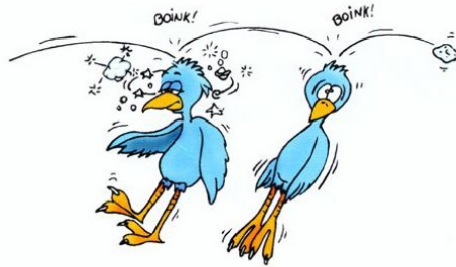
Kill two birds with one stone

To present a counter argument.



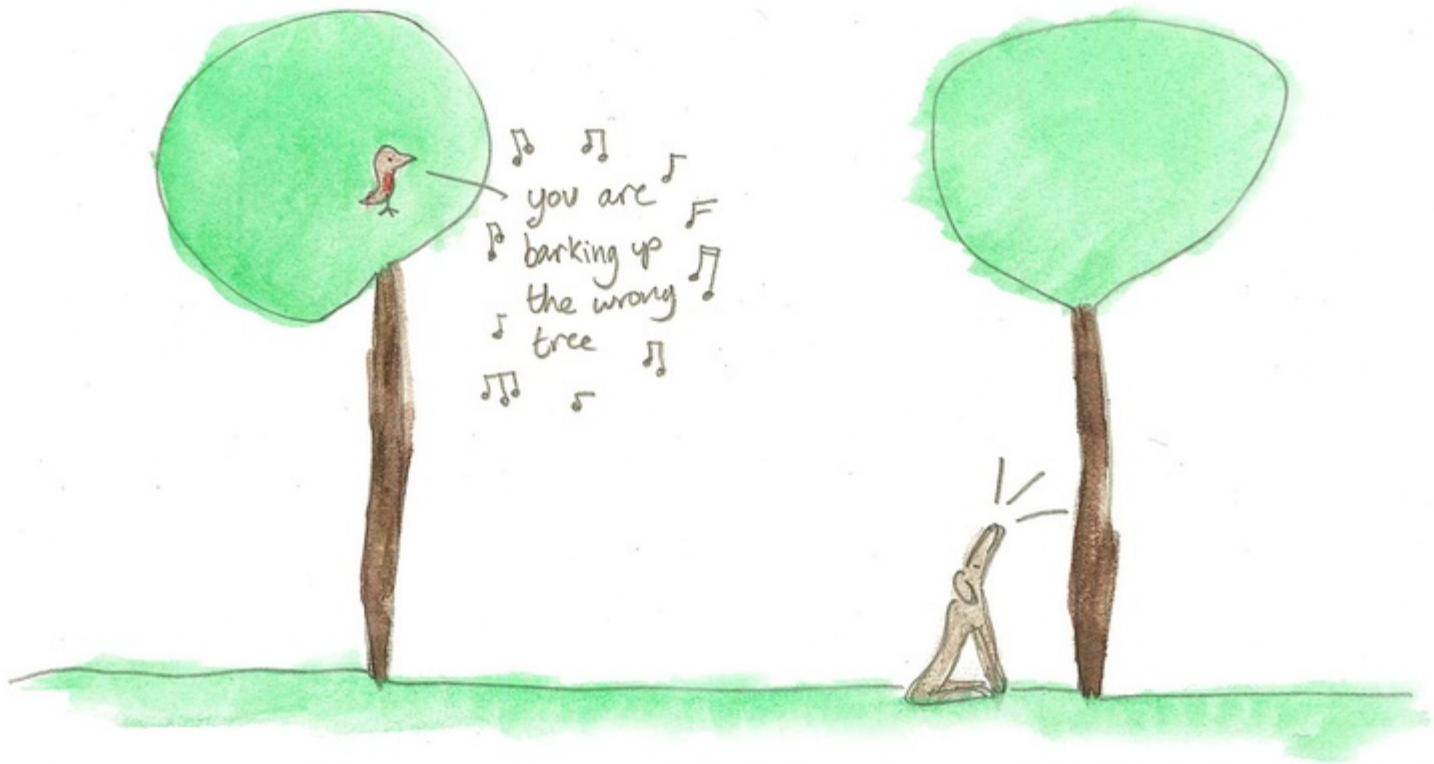
Not playing with a full deck
